

WHAT SHOULD I WEAR?

We are very proud of our Sixth Form and have high expectations of our students. This applies to work ethic and effort but also presentation and appearance. The Sixth Form is a place of study and work and the business like dress code reflects this.

SHIRTS

Shirt with collar, polo shirt or blouse – T-shirts are only acceptable if they are smart and appropriate. Tops that expose the stomach or reveal the chest are unacceptable as are strapless or backless tops.




ID BADGES & LANYARDS

ID cards on lanyards must be worn at all times within the Academy.

TROUSERS

Trousers should be smart. Jeans should only be worn if they are smart and not ripped. No tracksuit bottoms should be worn.



JUMPERS

Jumper, cardigan or smart sweatshirts are acceptable. Large logos are not acceptable and hoods must be down in the building at all times.

SHOES

Shoes or boots should be sensible and appropriate for a place of work and study. Smart trainers are acceptable. Bare feet should not be exposed and shoes with a very high heel must not be worn.



SKIRTS

Skirts, shorts and dresses should be mid-thigh or longer and not have rips or large slits.

LEGGINGS

Leggings with a short top are not acceptable but leggings may be worn with a longer top.



JEWELLERY

Most jewellery is considered acceptable however students may be required to remove items if an excessive amount of jewellery is worn. Safe and sensible piercing is permitted.

There will be times throughout the year when all sixth form students will be required to dress in formal attire such as suits and business wear. These include Remembrance Day, Speech, Mock Trial, Open Days, Prize Giving and interview days. Ensure you have access to appropriate formal wear for these occasions.

It is the right of senior members of staff at the academy to determine whether a particular item of dress is appropriate for the sixth form or not. Students who turn up to the academy inappropriately dressed will be asked to go home and change.
