
Patriarchs of the Jewish Bible.



Key Vocabulary

Circumcision – The removal of a baby boy's foreskin at the age of 8 days in Judaism.

Covenant – An agreement between God and people

Patriarch – key biblical figures who are

regarded as being fathers/founders.

Pharaoh – An Egyptian King.

Twelve tribes of Israel – The families of the sons of Jacob.

Key Facts

- God tested Abraham's faith by asking him to sacrifice his son Isaac.

 Abraham was willing to do so and God spared Isaac.
- Jews view Abraham as the first patriarch. Isaac was the second patriarch and his son Jacob was the third.
 - Abraham made a covenant with God so that his descendants would become a great nation.
 - Isaac had twin sons, Esau and Jacob.
- Jacob tricked Isaac into giving him Esau's birth right as the oldest twin.

 Jacob then ran away to escape the wrath of his brother.
- Jacob fell in love with Rachel and promised to work for his uncle Laban for seven years in return for her hand in marriage.
 - Laban tricked Jacob into marrying his older daughter Leah.
- Jacob's favourite son, Joseph was sold by his brothers and ended up in the hands of the Egyptian Pharaoh.

Key people

Jacob – The son of Isaac and the third patriarch

Abraham – A man who is held up as a good example because of his obedience to God. Esau – Jacobs twin brother The first patriarch.

Joseph – 11th son of Jacob

Isaac – The son of Abraham and second patriarch
