#### **Helen Wells**

**Biosphere**- An area recognised for it's unique natural habitat, promotion of conservation and sustainability.



### 3D-

**Clay-** This comes from the ground and is used to mould into 3D shapes. It is used in a wide variety of products such as cups and plates, sculptures, tiles and even cosmetics.

**Form-** A shape that has a three dimensional surface.

**Relief-** A raised surface with a flat background.

**Texture-** The way a surface feels e.g. rough or smooth.

**Ceramic Artist** – someone who works with clay.

Glaze – powder that often includes glass, made into a liquid and applied to a piece of ceramics, which then creates a glassy coating when fired in a kiln.

### **Courtney Mattison**



Courtney Maddison is a Ceramic Artist and Marine Biologist who creates large scale installation style pieces based on coral reefs. Each Artwork is made up of hundreds of separate ceramic forms, usually the central pieces have colourful glazes and the outer ones are pure white. This highlights the effects of global warming which causes coral reefs to bleach and eventually die. Her ceramic forms are made individually and have intricate patterns and textures on their surfaces. Her aim is to raise awareness of the beauty of coral reefs and the fragile nature of ocean ecosystems.

#### Colour-

#### Watercolour Techniques

**Wash:** a layer of colour that has been diluted with a lot of water and is used in backgrounds and to build up layers of colour.

**Graded wash:** Colour fading from strong/dark to light/pale, usually in one colour.

**Variegated wash:** two or more colours blending together.

**Wet on wet:** Adding watercolour to a wet layer of paint to allow colours to spread.

**Stippling:** a textured effect made by dabbing the tip of the bush onto the paper.

**Texture:** This can be created with different brushstrokes built up in layers.

**Salt:** This is added to a wet layer of paint so it absorbs the colour and creates random interesting effects.

#### Watercolour pencil

A water soluble coloured pencil that can be used with water to convert into paint.

Acrylic Paint — This is A fast drying thick paint.
