- Christianity began in present-day Israel nearly 2000 years ago. It began with the belief that Jesus had died to forgive people's sins and was resurrected from the dead so that all people could have eternal life.
- Christianity developed out of Judaism, but at the Council • of Jerusalem it was decided that both gentiles (non Jews) and Jews could become Christians.
 - Christians are monotheists who believe in the Trinity God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
 - The Christian holy book is the Bible, which is divided into the Old and New Testaments. These were written by many people over centuries. Christians of different denominations interpret the Bible in different ways.
 - The Gospels within the New Testament include the books Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. They tell of the disciples time living alongside Jesus and key parts of Jesus' life and ministry.
